Shingle Making

Learn how to make roof shingles by hand on a practical one day course organised by Woodnet and Plumpton College at Flimwell.

Wood shingles provide a natural, durable and attractive roof or wall covering for buildings of any size from a log store to a workshop or house. The shingles are cleaved from round wood to give them greater strength.

Your tutor, John Waller, will show you how to select suitable wood and how to cleave and shape the shingles using hand tools. You will then practise these skills and lay out, hang and fix the shingles to a roof structure. You will use oak but the skills you learn can also be applied to sweet chestnut and cedar.
